
Grossword Puzzle

16th Sunday after Pentecost

Hello friends! If your grown-ups are serving up dessert and your sibling gets half of the delicious chocolate cake that's covered in rich, oooey gooey chocolate frosting topped with sprinkles and then you get a thin little slice, what are the first words that will come out of your mouth? I bet I know. "HEY! THAT'S NOT FAIR!" Am I right? I know! It's not fair, is it? We all want the same amount or WE want to be the ones with the bigger slice. When we say the words "that's not fair", it usually means that we want something that someone else has or that something is not going out way.

In our Gospel lesson from Matthew, Jesus tells the story of a landowner that doesn't seem quite fair. The landowner hired workers to labor in his vineyard. Some, he hired at the beginning of the day, some in the middle, and some at the end of the day. When it was time to pay them, he paid them all the same. Guess what those workers said? "HEY! THAT'S NOT FAIR!". The landowner paid the same wage to those who worked only one hour and those who worked all day long. But it was the landowner's money, right? Doesn't he get to decide how to spend it? He paid the workers what he agreed to pay them and he was generous. Do you think that's fair?

The question for today is this: Is God fair? Of course, God is fair! But do you know what else? The Bible tells us that God is more than fair; the Bible tells us that "God is love." Does God love us because we love God? No, the Bible says, This is real love—not that we loved God, but that God loved us first and every day, God showers us with mercy, forgiveness, and grace. Wow! That's love. I'm glad that God gives me love and grace, in spite of what I deserve!

Loving God, you are fair and wise and love us beyond measure. We thank you for the grace and mercy that you give us every day. Help us to be gracious with all whom you put on our path. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
