Fifth Sunday in Lent

Jeremiah 31:31-34 Hebrews 5:5-10 Psalm 51:1-12 (10) John 12:20-33

Hellooo friends! How many of you have seen an acorn? They remind me of little brown fairies with cute hats. Maybe some of you have them in your yard at home or have seen them when you take walks with your family? Do you know what an acorn grows up to be? A big tall mighty oak tree! Oak trees live for hundreds of years and have deep, deep roots. So, here's a question for you today...does an acorn have to stop being an acorn so that it can live as an oak tree? Yep. It sure does.

In our gospel lesson from John, Jesus tells his friends, the disciples about a grain of wheat.


He tells them that that grain of wheat can't do what it is supposed to do, which is grow into a plant unless it stops being a grain of wheat. Jesus says that it's like the grain of wheat died.

Now, this is a sad thing, that the grain of wheat has to die. But, living as a plant sounds much better than living as a tiny grain, like a seed. The plant can offer things the seed can't, like shelter, shade, and food. It can even grow more seeds just like an oak tree grows more acorns.

The reason Jesus is talking to the disciples about a grain of wheat dying so that it can become a plant is that Jesus knows that he will soon stop being Jesus in the way his disciples know him.

Jesus knows he's going to die and then be resurrected, brought back to life to live with God. But once he's resurrected, he's going to be different. Jesus, then, wants his disciples to think about his life, death, and resurrection in the same way they would think about a seed turning into a plant. He wants them to know that his resurrected life will be like a plant that keeps growing and has new seeds, and that the disciples will become the seeds that are part of his new life. These "seeds" will scatter and share God's love, just like Jesus did. And guess what? We are part of Jesus' new life too, just like the disciples.
