Genesis 9:8-17 Romans 4:13-35 Psalm 22:23-31 Mark 8:31-38


Hellooo friends! When I was in elementary school, all of us had responsibilities in the classroom. The teacher would choose people to do certain tasks like erase the board, pass out papers, and my favorite, line leader. Do they still do that today? Have you ever been a line leader? If not, let me explain. The line leader gets to be the first one at the door and everyone else gets to follow the leader. The line leader is responsible for leading the rest of the class to a designated spot like the cafeteria, the library, or the playground. It's kind of a big job!

In our gospel lesson from Mark today, we hear about Jesus' friend, Peter. Jesus, the leader of the disciples, is talking to his friends about some things that they do not want to hear, that Jesus must begin his journey to Jerusalem and that it won't be an easy task. Peter, worried about Jesus' safety tells Jesus to avoid the things that will bring him harm. Peter got turned around and forgot who was leading, not him, but Jesus. Jesus then tells Peter to get behind him, as a reminder to turn back around so he could see Jesus again and follow him.

It's easy to get turned around, but we have to remember that we're not always chosen to be the leader. The only one who gets that title full-time is Jesus. Jesus points us in the direction of God and leads us right to where God needs us to be. It's not always easy to follow, like when we need to forgive someone who has hurt us, but we can always trust Jesus to lead us in the right direction.

Loving God, you sent us your son Jesus to keep us in line and to guide us on the right path. Help us to follow with our whole hearts. Amen.
