- **Adult Depends**—The Food Pantry distributed the items to several pantry clients. Many clients needed the items due to medical conditions or recovering from surgery.
- Black History Month Books—The Book Ministry distributed books in honor of Black History Month
- **Dental Health**—The Food Pantry distributed toothbrushes and toothpaste to the food pantry clients. The items helped the clients on a path to maintaining their teeth, reducing dental bills, and allowed them to use their limited funds to support other needs.
- Easter Books—The Book Ministry distributed books in honor of Easter
- Soap Bars and Wash Cloths—The Food Pantry distributed bars of soap and wash clothes
 to clients. The items helped the clients maintain personal hygiene, preparation for job interviews and to use their limited funds to support other needs.
- Grace Lutheran Food Pantry (four different action teams)—The Food Pantry purchased food that was not available through the Food Bank or donations to supplement items for clients.
- Thanksgiving Baskets—The Food Pantry purchased food for and handed out 7 Thanksgiving Baskets.
- Turkeys for Indian River Middle School—A \$250 Thrivent Action Team Grant was used to buy 15 turkeys for the Indian River Middle Schools Thanksgiving Baskets.

In January, we collected over \$1000 in gift cards, \$250 worth of household items, games, and art supplies (bought with Thrivent Action Team grant), and a handful of clothing items for two families who were referred to us by Chesapeake Public Schools.

Grace Lutheran Chesapeake Youth's 2022 Collection raised:

\$100 and 235 food items

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry distributed
109,435 lbs. of food to 3,977 individuals.

The need for food is great and we are averaging 28 families receiving each Monday. Everyone food visiting our Food Pantry gets food. NO ONE leaves without food. The food we distribute is made possible by the generous donations of money and food from our congregation, area churches, and organizations. In addition, receive United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) food from the Food Bank of Southeastern Virginia and Eastern Shore. The 3-4,000 lbs of food each week is manually handled three times—loaded onto trucks, offloaded at church and put on shelves and freezers. In order to distribute and have the food, we have a dedicated group volunteers. Without these volunteers each week, we would be closed and the hungry people in our

community would not receive the food. The pantry saw many new people coming due to increased food, gas, and rent prices. Many have a limited income, recently lost a job, or have family members who have moved back into the house, so they did not have enough to purchase the food that they needed. The recipients were very appreciative of the food.

Stewardship





For 2022, there were 77 contributing households, down from 85 in 2021. The distribution, by the size of the average monthly financial contribution, is provided below.



Of note, of the 77 households,

- 13 provided a single gift for the year
- 6 provided quarterly gifts
- 39 provided monthly gifts
- 19 provided weekly gifts
- 45 percent use electronic giving (tithe.ly)
- 55 percent provide "physical" gifts (in the offering plate or via mail)
