Mission Statement:

We are a community of believers in Christ called to be servants to all people.

What are the practices for remembering baptism?

We are baptized once, but every Sunday, we are reminded of our baptism. Every day we live out our baptismal callings. To quote Luther's frequently asked question, "what does this mean?" What does it mean to "remember baptism?"

Background

We remember baptism in our daily life and in our worship life. This entry will focus on the second dimension, remembering baptism in worship. For more on baptism and daily life, see the resource list below.

In the Using Evangelical Lutheran Worship: The Christian Life, the authors lift up the centrality of baptism in worship:

As an expression of its central place in the life of the Christian community, baptism has a natural home within the pattern of the assembly's worship. Because we understand baptism as the wellspring of Christian living, we can see significant parallels between the celebration of baptism and the pattern for Christian Worship" (p. 49).

By meeting together as an assembly of believers, we are, in a very real sense, remembering our baptism. What are some specific opportunities for such remembrance? We'll consider this by looking at the four parts of the worship service: Gathering, Word, Meal and Sending.

Practice: Baptism in the Pattern of Worship Gathering

- Confession and Forgiveness. This option for gathering is centered in our baptism, in dying to sin and being made alive in Christ. "Absolution is a speaking and hearing of the Word of God and a return to Baptism" (The Use of the Means of Grace, Application 12A). The presiding minister may lead this element from the font, making visible its baptismal resonance.
- **Thanksgiving for Baptism.** An alternative option especially suited to the Easter season. (See Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 97; Leaders Desk edition, p. 18)

Word

- **Preaching and song.** Pastors and musicians wisely make connections between scripture and our baptismal life through the words we hear and sing.
- **Apostles' or Nicene Creed.** We declare the faith begun in our baptism through the reciting of the creed.
- **Prayers of Intercession.** These prayers include petitions for the recently baptized or those to be baptized. When we pray for others, we are living out our baptism as a community in Christ.

Meal

- Baptism leads to Holy Communion. "Admission to the Sacrament is by invitation of the Lord, presented through the Church to those who are baptized" (The Use of the Means of Grace, Principle 37).
- Since Communion is given to the baptized, some congregations have the

practice of communing infants and young children. (See <u>"At what</u> <u>age do congregation members</u> receive their First Communion?")

Sending

- The sending rite links our baptism in worship to baptism in our daily life. In baptism, we are welcomed to join the assembly in "bearing God's creative and redeeming word to the world" (Holy Baptism, ELW p. 231). Announcing the dismissal from the font visibly connects worship with our Christian witness.
- The Affirmation of Christian Vocation (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 84; Leaders' Desk Edition, p. 155) sends us forth from worship with a renewed sense of call to Christ's mission (See The Use of the Means of Grace, Principle 52). This document on word and sacramental practices continues:

Baptism and baptismal catechesis join the baptized to the mission of Christ...In the teaching and practice of congregations, the missional intentions for the means of grace needs to be recalled. By God's gift, the Word and the sacraments are set in the midst of the world, for the life of the world (The Use of the Means of Grace, 51A/B). For baptismal echoes at other times and in other occasions, see The Christian Life (pp. 35-40).

There has been a lot that has happened this past month. The congregation voted to authorize the Council to spend up to \$15,000 for a new HVAC unit for classrooms 1 and 2. The contractor has been selected and they are waiting for the unit to arrive to install it. This new unit will ensure that the Education Wina will be available for use, however that looks, far into the future. The Spring Flea Market went off amazingly on April 13th. The Flea Market brought in \$1,655, which will be split between the Growing in Grace Building Fund and the HER Shelter. Thank you to all that were involved and who came out to support. Looking ahead, this summer Sunday service will be at 9am starting on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th as Sunday School will be on hiatus until after Labor Day. In **March 2024**, Grace Lutheran received **\$15,245.70** in giving to the General Fund. Because of your generosity, we were able to:

Welcoming & Affirming: Supporting LGBTQIA+ Youth in our Families & Synod On May 6, 13, 20, and June 3 at 7pm on Zoom

Why does language matter so much to LGBTQIA+ teens?

How can families celebrate milestones in the lives of their LGBTQIA+ teens? How can I create a culture of affirmation in my church?

The Tapestry Team's LGBTQIA+ Thread will explore these questions and more in their book study on Welcoming and Affirming: A Guide to Supporting with LGBTQ+ Christian Youth. This is for parents, guardians, rostered ministers, youth leaders, grandparents, and anyone who wants to learn how to better love and care for the LGBTQIA+ teens in their lives.


The study will be facilitated by George Donovan, Tapestry Co-chair, and Pastor Colleen Montgomery, All Places Together & Director for Digital Ministries - Virginia Synod, along with other voices from the LGBTQIA+ community as well. Each session will include a devotion, time for questions from participants, storytelling from LGBTQIA+ Lutherans in Virginia, and brainstorming of practical steps to care for our youth.

(Sunday evening to Friday noon)


Kairos is our summertime, week-long faithsharing event for youth who will be in 9th-12th grades in the fall. It is held at Rognoke College in Salem, VA and is especially for young people who are already committed to a life of faith to be part of a unique Christian community for an entire week, to have a fresh experience of the grace and presence of God in that community, and to develop habits for discipleship that can be taken home as they live out their baptismal call to be followers of Jesus. Kairos is different from our weekend events in that congregations do not send advisors with youth; the event staff serves as small group leaders and dorm advisors for the week. We enjoy lots of singing and skits and fun and friend-making, prayers, and worship, plus participants gather in small groups that meet throughout the week. There are so many beloved features of Kairos: event theme t-shirts, Open Talent Mic Show, faith testimonies, comic relief, reflection time, prayer stations, speed friending, t-shirt fashion show, and more!

("Kairos" is the New Testament Greek word for "special time." It is used whenever God's people want to talk about a time of change, of renewal, of God's special work in the believer and the community.)
