Maybe there was a birthday party that you didn't get to go to where someone popped the pinata and all kinds of money fell out...or maybe you heard a story about a friend who went fishing and caught a GIANT catfish, bigger than his head? Would you believe the stories even though you weren't there to witness them?


In our Gospel lesson from John, we hear about one of Jesus' disciples named Thomas who wasn't where he was supposed to be and missed out on something really spectacular. Jesus had told his disciples to stay together after he died and they did, all except Thomas. While Thomas was away, the resurrected Jesus appeared to the disciples, and Thomas missed out. When the other disciples told Thomas what he had missed, Thomas didn't believe them. Maybe it's because he didn't see Jesus for himself. I think Thomas was probably upset because he didn't do what Jesus asked him to do. The good news is that Jesus gave Thomas a second chance to see him!

We are all invited to learn what Jesus taught, together, and we are all invited to pray together. If we should forget, Jesus gives us second (and third and fourth) chances to try again. When we do the things that Jesus calls us to do together, we can better understand exactly WHO Jesus is and we, too, can better "see" the resurrected Jesus by learning from each other.

Loving God, thank you for other believers who help us to see and know who Jesus is. Amen.

We believe because he told us. We can always trust in Jesus' promises. Talk about this with your family.
