The Gifts of Advent Week 1: The Gift of Patience



A gift is given freely and offered in love. In the weeks before Christmas, we often race around finding just the right gifts for friends and family. The season of Advent is itself a gift—a time set apart to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. We give thanks for God's gift to us in the baby of Bethlehem.

This series highlights four aspects of Advent that become blessings and gifts in our lives: patience, speech and silence, hope, and family.

Week 1: The Gift of Patience

Waiting is hard. We eagerly anticipate the desires of our hearts and want them to come soon. We wait for the first day of school or the first snowfall.
